ASHOVER PARISH NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The neighbourhood plan for Ashover has now passed the independent examination stage, which is one of the final stages the plan has to go through before it becomes a 'made' plan. North East Derbyshire District Council reviewed the finalised plan at their committee meeting on 13th December 2017, where it received their approval to go forward to referendum.

The referendum will take place on the 8th February 2018 when we would ask that you all come out and vote.

For the plan to become 'made' we need a majority of those who vote to be in favour of the plan in other words 50% +1 of those voting would carry the plan through. Notices of the referendum will be posted throughout the parish and details will be on the Parish Council website <http://www.ashover-pc.gov.uk/>. A copy of the plan is on the website and copies will also be made available within the parish.

DEFIBRILLATORS - Ashover Parish Council has been working in partnership with Ashover Community Medical Centre Ltd., to provide defibrillators around one of the largest parishes in the country. Defibrillation within 3–5 min of collapse can produce survival rates as high as 50–70%. This can be achieved through public access defibrillation and when a bystander uses a nearby AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) to deliver the first shock. Each minute of delay to defibrillation reduces the probability of survival to hospital discharge by 10% so every minute is vital in ensuring that the patient is given every chance of leaving hospital.

Ashover Parish currently has 5 defibrillators sited around the parish:-

Ashover – outside the Medical Centre on Milken Lane

Alton – in the red kiosk on Alton Hill

Littlemoor – in the red kiosk opposite the bus shelter

Milltown – on the outside of 'The Miners Arms' public house

Uppertown – outside the Social Centre

It is anticipated that a further defibrillator will be sited in Kelstedge soon.

The units can be accessed by a unique code obtained by an emergency call to the 999 service. The defibrillators are fully automatic and are housed in a temperature controlled, lit cabinet. The unit can be used by anyone, as it provides full audible instructions.

Please include your name, name and address of group, telephone number, email address and any other relevant information. Registered charities are required to include their registration number and charity name. Groups can only nominate one trustee and trustees can only represent one group, therefore, you cannot reply on another trustee to be able to act on behalf of your group or organisation.'
